

Uncrewed Services Advisory Network – Meeting 4 <u>Meeting Summary</u>

Discussion

Members discussed:

- USAN welcomed three new members: David Lamb AMSL Aero, Will Whitelaw CASA, and Benedict Lyons Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts.
- Views of what constitutes Uncrewed Aircraft Systems Traffic Management (UTM) in Australia. Group conducted an exercise to facilitate discussion on Australia's UTM ecosystem. Highlights included:
 - UTM as an enabler that will provide situational awareness and enable a safe way to integrate emerging technologies with traditional aviation, unlocking benefits for all airspace users.
 - the definition of UTM changes dramatically depending where on the implementation timeline. UTM is simplistic at commencement, gradually becoming complex and more interconnected, especially when integrating UAS and conventional aircraft.
 - UTM can be considered as a jigsaw puzzle. There is a need to collaborate on a shared vision and work together on the jigsaw puzzle pieces. The group acknowledged it is important not to lose sight of the bigger picture and the need to collaborate to ensure the pieces fit together and that we have a shared vision.
- 'Myth busting' the Flight Information Management System (FIMS) to correct misunderstandings in relation to FIMS. Key highlights included:
 - FIMS is only one component of the UTM ecosystem the underpinning element enabling digital, automated, and scalable service delivery.
 - FIMS will support an open UAS Service Supplier (USS) market.
 - The need to mature capabilities to ensure that they are fit for purpose for the evolving needs of the Australian aviation industry.
- Members requested Airservices provide information on the longer-term goal of FIMS.
- Members requested information about FIMS capabilities. Airservices explained that it continued to work across government to resolve these, with a view to discuss once resolved.
- Frequentis Australasia was introduced as Airservices' strategic partner for the delivery of FIMS.
 - Frequentis has successfully rolled out UTM capabilities internationally and have been operating in Australia for 20 years.
 - Frequentis support UTM ecosystems in Norway, Estonia, Lithuania and Austria.
- The Chair advised that Frequentis representatives will participate in future USAN meetings.



- Additional promotional activities undertaken to help increase exposure for the expressions of interest (EOI) process for the USAN working groups. USAN members were thanked for helping raising awareness of the EOI process.
- The Automated Airspace Authorisations Working Group (AAAWG) terms of reference and membership have been finalised, with invitations to be sent to AAAWG members this month.
- Greg Tyrell, Executive Director of the Australian Association for Uncrewed Systems (AAUS), provided an overview of two AAUS documents (circulated to members prior to the meeting):
 - o AAM Industry Vision and Roadmap
 - o Industry Survey on an Australian UTM
- Airservices recommended that an upcoming USAN meeting be conducted face to face to help facilitate the work of the USAN. Members recommended scheduling the USAN meeting coincident with an industry event such as the AAUS AAM Summit, given many USAN members would likely already be attending the industry event.
- The Chairs facilitated an open discussion with members. Discussion elements included:
 - Ensuring the policy and the regulatory safeguards around what we are doing, from an implementation perspective through the USAN, remain coordinated and aligned
 - Airservices intent to match its services to the needs of industry
 - Public acceptance issues, including noise
 - Risk of misalignment where technology is moving at a rapid pace, and resources are constrained
 - Addressable market, price, and cost recovery considerations in the ecosystem
 - o Integration with traditional airspace operations and users
 - Airspace risks below 5,000 feet, including between beyond visual line of sight UAS and crewed aircraft, particularly in Class G airspace, and the need for electronic conspicuity.
